

Small groups gain funds for health work

More than a dozen nonprofits throughout the region received funding from the Greater Rochester Health Foundation through a new program for smaller organizations promoting health and well-being.

Community Health Grants range from \$5,000 to \$50,000 and support short-term activities or organizations whose primary mission is health services and/or health promotion. These agencies, organizations, departments or programs might not qualify for the foundation's larger, longer-term grants.

The first cycle of funding for 2014 resulted in a 15 organizations receiving a combined \$218,803.
