### **GRANT OPPORTUNITIES**

- From Rochester Area Community Foundation: The Wayne County Community Endowment supports improving the health and quality of life of Wayne County residents. New this year, WCCE will be accepting Letters of Intent (LOI) prior to the full application process. The LOI acceptance period closes on January
   Select applicants will be invited to submit full applications by March 24, 2023.
- New York State is creating a \$150 million workforce development grant program designed to support training programs and assist education and training providers. The funding will cover two initiatives, \$115 million for performance grants that support training programs that offer certifications in high-demand fields and \$35 million for education and workforce training providers who train future employees for high-quality in-demand jobs. Grant applications are available on the Office of Strategic Workforce Development's website.
- Health-related grant opportunities -- both local and nation-wide -- are posted weekly on the Greater Rochester Health Foundation website.
- The <u>North Star Coalition</u> is committed to a better future in the Greater Rochester area by working with stakeholders from across the region to ensure that Federal and State recovery funds will be used to create opportunities for the benefit and economic prosperity of historically excluded residents.
