The Fatherhood Connection has been facilitating the Men's parenting and personal development group for over 18 years and in several counties in Western New York.




El Camino neighborhood, where many of our programs and development efforts are focused on, sharing some of the Latinx Agenda roundtable findings and civic engagement recommendations.

NEW: The New York Health Foundation (NYHealth) 2024 Special Projects Fund Request for Proposals (RFP) is now open. Special Projects Fund awards are one-time, nonrenewable funding opportunities where the Foundation supports projects

that address important and emerging health care and public health issues that fall outside of its three priority areas (Primary Care; Healthy Food, Healthy Lives; and Veterans' Health). NY Health seeks to partner with a wide range of organizations implementing innovative projects that can improve health at the local, regional, or statewide levels. Applicants must first complete a letter of inquiry form (LOI) to determine whether a proposed project fits the funding criteria by **1 p.m., Tuesday, Sept. 12**. Review the RFP and apply here.

The application process for the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation Arts & Culture Initiative closes Friday, Sept. 15. In 2023, \$500,000 in funding will be awarded primarily to support small to mid-sized 501(c)(3) arts and cultural organizations that are physically located in and/or operate from the eight counties of Western New York (Allegany, Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Erie, Genesee, Niagara, Orleans and Wyoming) plus Monroe County. Organizations with a budget of no more than \$2 million in their fiscal year 2022 are encouraged to apply.
