			Mary's Place Refugee Outreach serves Rochester's resettled refugees living in the city's northwest neighborhoods. Refugee families arrive in the United States with significant health and economic challenges and encounter formidable barriers to getting the supports and opportunities they need to meet basic needs for a healthy, stable life. These barriers include unfamiliar language and culture, numerous complicated service systems and programs, and few culturally appropriate services. Mary's Place Case Management program provides refugee families with easy-to-access, hands-on, free help to secure the supports they need. Refugee need and demand for our case management assistance has risen significantly over the last five years. We served 129 families in 2017 and 246 families this year (to date). The number of sessions provided also rose from 254 in 2017 to 1,606 so far this year. We are requesting Health Foundation funding for a full-time case manager who will provide supervision for case managers to assure quality for program clients and also expand our case management capacity.
